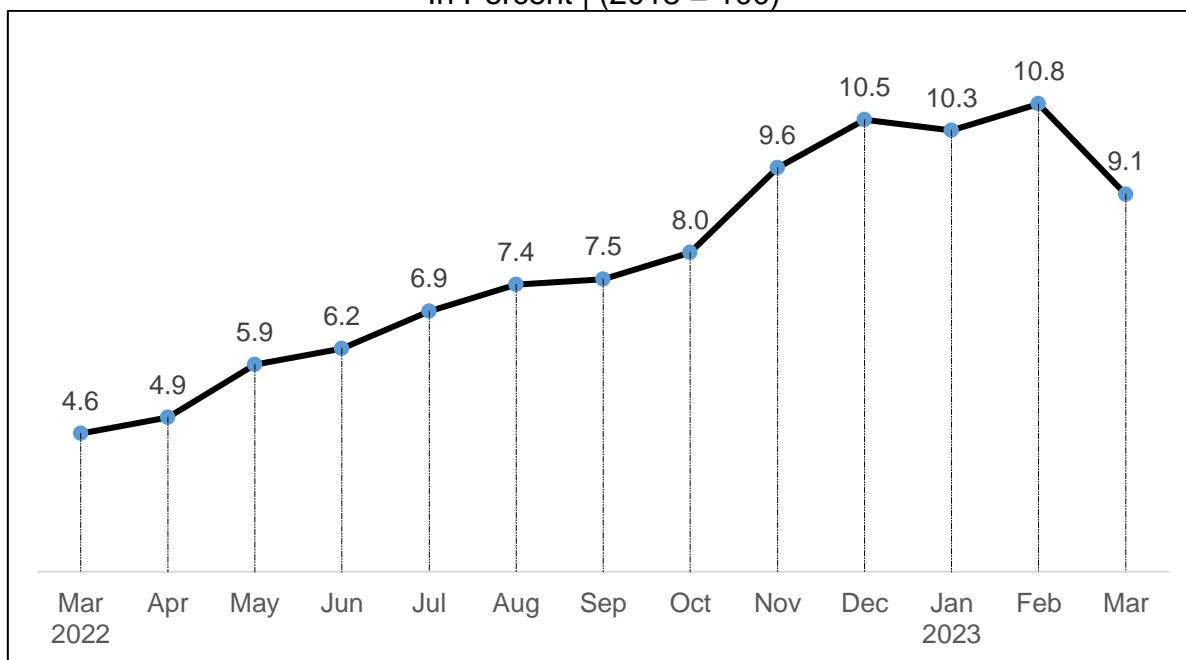

## 1. Western Visayas

### 1.1. *Headline Inflation*

Headline inflation or overall inflation in Western Visayas slowed down to 9.1 percent in March 2023, from 10.8 percent in February 2023. In March 2022, the inflation was lower at 4.6 percent. (Table A and Figure 1)

#### 1.1.1 *Main Drivers to the Downward Trend of the Headline Inflation*

The deceleration of the overall inflation in Western Visayas in March 2023 was mainly due to the lower inflation in the index of Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels at 9.5 percent, from 14.2 percent in February 2023. This was followed by Food and non-alcoholic beverages with 10.3 inflation, from 11.7 percent in the previous month. Third top driver to the downtrend is the index of Transport with 7.9 percent inflation rate from 12.3 percent in February 2023.

On the other hand, higher inflation rates were observed in the following indices:

- a. Alcoholic beverages and tobacco, 12.7 percent;
- b. Clothing and footwear, 4.1 percent;
- c. Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance, 9.1 percent;
- d. Health, 2.5 percent;
- e. Information and communication, 2.5 percent;
- f. Recreation, Sport and culture, 5.1 percent;
- g. Restaurants and Accommodation Services, 12.8 percent, and
- h. Personal Care, and Miscellaneous Goods and Services, 7.3 percent.

Meanwhile, inflation for Education services (0.4 percent) and Financial services (0.0 percent) remained at their previous month's inflation rates (Table B).

### *1.2 Main Contributors to the Headline Inflation*

In terms of contribution to the Western Visayas headline inflation rate of 9.1 percent in March 2023, the top three commodity groups were the following:

- a. Food and non-alcoholic beverages with 48.7 percent share or 4.4 percentage points;
- b. Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels with 19.8 percent share or 1.8 percentage points; and
- c. Restaurants and accommodation services at 8.8 percent share or 0.8 percentage points.

## **2.0 Food Inflation**

Food inflation of Western Visayas in March 2023 slowed down to 10.6 percent in March 2023, from 12.1 percent in February 2023. Food inflation in March 2022 was lower at 5.7 percent. (Table C)

### *2.1 Main Drivers to the Downward Trend of Food Inflation*

The deceleration of food inflation was mainly brought about by lower year-on-year growth in the index of Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses at 18.7 percent from 24.8 percent in February 2023. This was followed by Fish and other seafood at 14.7 percent from 17.0 percent in February 2023. Third is Cereals and cereal products with 4.6 percent from 5.2 percent in the previous month.

Lower inflation rates during the month were also noted in the indices of the following food items:

- a. Milk, other dairy products and eggs, 10.7 percent;
- b. Oils and fats, 21.7 percent;
- c. Fruits and nuts, 9.4 percent; and
- d. Sugar, confectionery and desserts, 39.5 percent.

Conversely, higher inflation rates were noted in the following food groups during the month:

- a. Meat and other parts of slaughtered land animals, 6.8 percent; and
- b. Ready-made food and other food products not elsewhere classified, 9.7 percent.

### *2.2 Main Contributors to the Food Inflation*

With regard to contribution to the March 2023 headline inflation in Western Visayas, Food shared 46.4 percent or 4.2 percentage points. Among the food groups, top contributors to food inflation were:

- a. Fish and other seafood with 26.3 percent share or 2.8 percentage points;
- b. Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses with 15.6 percent share or 1.7 percentage points;
- c. Sugar, confectionery and desserts with 11.9 percent share or 1.3 percentage points.

## 2. Provinces

All of the six provinces in Western Visayas recorded downtrend in inflation rates in March 2023 from February 2023. Among the provinces, Negros Occidental had the highest monthly inflation rate of 10.8 percent, while Guimaras had the lowest at 6.4 percent.

Both of the highly urbanized cities in the region also exhibited slowdown in inflation rates. Among the provinces, Iloilo City inflation was noted at 11.6 percent from 13.2 percent in February. Bacolod City recorded 8.7 percent inflation in March 2023 from 11.2 percent in the previous month. (Table E)
