

A. Western Visayas

1. Headline Inflation

Western Visayas' headline inflation decelerated to 1.9 percent in April 2025, from 2.7 percent in March 2025. The regional average inflation from January to April 2025 is 2.7 percent. The inflation rate in April 2024 was higher at 4.1 percent. (Table A, Figure 1, and Table D)

1.1 Main Drivers to the Downtrend of the Headline Inflation

The downtrend in the Western Visayas inflation rate in April was mainly due to the slower annual growth in the index of Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages which was noted at 0.9 percent during the month from 2.5 in March 2025. The index of Transport was the second driver to the downtrend, with - 2.1 percent inflation in April 2025 from -1.1 percent in March 2025. Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas, and Other Fuels was the third major driver, at 3.7 percent inflation from 4.1 percent last month. Likewise, lower inflation was noted in the index of Restaurants and Accommodation Services at 2.8 percent from 3.4 percent.

In contrast, higher inflation rates were noted in the following commodity groups:

- a. Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco, 5.9 percent from 5.2 percent;
- b. Clothing and Footwear, 3.8 percent from 3.7 percent;
- c. Health, 2.7 percent from 2.6 percent;
- d. Information and Communication, 0.4 percent from 0.3 percent; and
- e. Recreation, Sport and Culture, 3.2 percent from 3.0 percent.

The indices of Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance with inflation rate of 4.3 percent, Education Services with 8.1 percent, Financial Services with 0.0 percent, and Personal Care, and Miscellaneous Goods and Services with 2.5 percent recorded inflation rates which were similar to the previous month's annual growth. 1.2 Major Contributors to the Headline Inflation

The top three commodity groups contributing to the Western Visayas headline inflation rate of 1.9 percent in April were the following (Table B):

- a. Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels, with 33.4 percent share or 0.64 percentage points;
- b. Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages with 21.2 percent share or 0.40 percentage point; and
- c. Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco with 11.2 percent share or 0.21 percentage point.

2. Food Inflation

Food inflation in Western Visayas slowed down to 0.8 percent in April 2025 from 2.4 percent in March 2025. Food inflation in April 2024 was higher at 7.5 percent. (Table C)

2.1 Main Drivers of the Downtrend in Food Inflation

The deceleration in food inflation in April 2025 was due to slower annual growth in the index of Cereals and cereal products, with -3.7 percent inflation rate in April 2025 from 0.5 percent in March 2025. This was followed by the group of Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses with slower annual growth of 4.1 percent during the month from 6.3 percent in the previous month. Meat and other parts of slaughtered land animals also contributed to the downtrend with 4.0 percent inflation rate in April 2025 from 4.2 percent inflation rate in March 2025. Slower annual growth was also noted in the indices of Fruits and Nuts with 2.5 percent inflation rate in April 2025 from 2.9 percent in March 2025 and Sugar, Confectionery and Desserts with -0.9 percent inflation during the month from -0.7 percent in the previous month.

On the other hand, faster annual growth was observed in the following food commodity groups:

- a. Fish and other seafood, 1.8 percent from 1.7 percent;
- b. Milk and Other Parts of Slaughtered Land Animals, 4.6 percent from 4.3 percent;
- c. Oils and Fats, 0.2 percent from 0.1 percent; and
- d. Ready-made food and other food products, n.e.c, 4.6 percent from 4.5 percent.

2.2 Main Contributors to the Food Inflation

Food had a share of 15.5 percent or 0.29 percentage points to Western Visayas' headline inflation rate in April 2025 (Table B). The top three food groups with the highest contribution to food inflation of 0.8 percent during the month were the following (Table C):

- a. Meat and Other Parts of Slaughtered Land Animals with 89.0 percent share or 0.71 percentage point;
- b. Vegetables, Tubers, Plantains, Cooking Bananas and Pulses with 54.4 percent share or 0.44 percentage point; and
- c. Milk, Other Dairy Products and Eggs with 46.7 percent share or 0.37 percentage point.

3. Inflation Rate for the Bottom 30% Income Households

April 2025 inflation rate for the Bottom 30% Income Households in Western Visayas decelerated to 1.3 percent from 2.8 percent inflation rate in March 2025. Inflation rate for Bottom 30% income households was higher in April 2024 at 5.2 percent inflation rate. (Table E)

3.1 Main Drivers to Downtrend of Bottom 30% Income Households Inflation

The downtrend in inflation rate for Bottom 30% Income Households was mainly brought about by the slower annual growth in the index of Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages with 0.5 percent inflation rate during the month, from 2.4 percent inflation in March 2025. It was followed by Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas, and Other Fuels, with inflation rate of 2.9 percent in April 2025, from 4.5 percent in the previous month. Restaurants and Accommodation Services also contributed to the downtrend in inflation rate for Bottom 30% Income Households with 2.8 percent inflation rate during the month from 4.4 percent inflation rate in the previous month. B. Provinces

Majority of the provinces in Western Visayas except for Guimaras registered downtrend in inflation rates in April 2025 from March 2025. Iloilo had the highest monthly inflation rate of 3.2 percent, while Antique had the lowest at -1.6 percent.

Both of the highly urbanized cities in the region registered deceleration in inflation rate during the month. Iloilo City recorded inflation rate of 3.2 percent from 3.9 percent while Bacolod City recorded 2.2 percent growth from 3.5 percent in the previous month.
