# Summary Inflation Report Consumer Price Index in Western Visayas for May 2025 (2018 = 100)

Date of Release: 10 June 2025 Reference No. 2025-SR26

#### Explanatory Notes

This special release presents the summary inflation report of Western Visayas for May 2025 excluding Negros Occidental and Bacolod City consequent to Republic Act No.12000, also known as "Negros Island Act". The data provided in this special release was taken from the latest available data of Retail Price Survey for the Generation of Consumer price Index of the Price Survey Division, Economic Sector Statistics Service, Sectoral Statistics Office of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA).



#### A. Western Visayas

#### 1. Headline Inflation

Western Visayas' headline inflation decelerated to 1.5 percent in May 2025, from 1.8 percent in April 2025. The regional average inflation from January to May 2025 is 2.6 percent. The inflation rate in May 2024 was higher at 4.3 percent. (Table A, Figure 1, and Table D)

#### 1.1 Main Drivers to the Downtrend of the Headline Inflation

The downtrend in the Western Visayas inflation rate in May was mainly due to the slower annual growth in the index of Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages which was noted at 0.3 percent during the month from 0.7 in April 2025. Transport also contributed at -3.0 percent inflation from -2.3 percent last month.

In contrast, higher inflation rates were noted in the following commodity groups:

- a. Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco, 4.9 percent from 4.7 percent;
- b. Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas, and other fuels, 4.7 percent from 4.6 percent;
- c. Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance,5.8 percent from 5.7 percent;
- d. Health, 2.3 percent from 2.0 percent;
- e. Information and Communication, 0.7 percent from 0.6 percent;
- f. Recreation, Sport and Culture, 4.0 percent from 3.0 percent, and
- g. Personal Care, and Miscellaneous Goods and Services, 2.7 percent from 2.4 percent.

The indices of Clothing and Footwear with inflation rate of 2.5 percent, Education Services with 2.2 percent, Restaurants and Accommodation Services with 2.6 percent and Financial Services with 0.0 percent recorded inflation rates which were similar to the previous month's annual growth. (Table B)

#### 1.2 Major Contributors to the Headline Inflation

The top three commodity groups contributing to the Western Visayas headline inflation rate of 1.5 percent in May 2025 were the following (Table B):

- a. Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels, with 52.1 percent share or 0.78 percentage points;
- b. Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance with 13.1 percent share or 0.20 percentage point; and
- c. Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco with 11.3 percent share or 0.17 percentage point.

#### 2. Food Inflation

Food inflation in Western Visayas slowed down to -0.1 percent in May 2025 from 0.5 percent in April 2025. Food inflation in May 2024 was higher at 7.9 percent. (Table C)

#### 2.1 Main Drivers of the Downtrend in Food Inflation

The deceleration in food inflation in May 2025 was mainly due to slower annual growth in the index of Cereals and cereal products, with -9.0 percent inflation rate in May 2025 from -4.5 percent in April 2025. This was followed by the group of Ready-made food and other food products, n.e.c with slower annual growth of 5.3 percent during the month from 5.7 percent in the previous month. Slower annual growth was also noted in the index of Milk and Other Parts of Slaughtered Land Animals with 3.8 percent inflation rate in May 2025 from 4.0 percent in April.

On the other hand, faster annual growth was observed in the following food commodity groups:

- a. Fish and other seafood, 5.7 percent from 2.0 percent;
- b. Oils and Fats, 3.3 percent from 2.9 percent;
- c. Fruits and Nuts, 8.2 percent from 4.1 percent; and
- d. Vegetables, Tubers, Plantains, Cooking Bananas and Pulses, 2.2 percent from 0.8 percent.

#### 2.2 Main Contributors to the Food Inflation

Food had a share of -2.7 percent or -0.04 percentage points to Western Visayas' headline inflation rate in May 2025 (Table B). The top three food groups with the highest contribution to food inflation of -0.1 percent during the month were the following (Table C):

- a. Cereals and Cereal Products with 3,370.4 percent share or -3.37 percentage point, and
- b. Sugar, Confectionery and Desserts with 48.2 percent share or -0.05 percentage point.

#### 3. Inflation Rate for the Bottom 30% Income Households

May 2025 inflation rate for the Bottom 30% Income Households in Western Visayas decelerated to 0.3 percent from 2.8 percent inflation rate in April 2025. Inflation rate for Bottom 30% income households was higher in May 2024 at 5.8 percent inflation rate. (Table E)

#### 3.1 Main Drivers to Downtrend of Bottom 30% Income Households Inflation

The downtrend in inflation rate for Bottom 30% Income Households was mainly brought about by the slower annual growth in the index of Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages with -1.0 percent inflation rate during the month, from -0.2 percent inflation in April 2025. Transport also contributed to the downtrend in inflation rate for Bottom 30% Income Households with -4.2 percent inflation rate during the month from -3.6 percent inflation rate in the previous month. #### **B.** Provinces

Two provinces in Western Visayas, that is Capiz and Iloilo registered downtrend in inflation rates in May 2025 from April 2025. Out of the five provinces, Iloilo had the highest monthly inflation rate of 2.8 percent, while Antique had the lowest at -1.3 percent.

Conversely, Iloilo City, the region's highly urbanized city within the region registered acceleration in inflation rate during the month recording inflation rate of 3.3 percent from 3.2 percent in the previous month.
