Production (operational definition) is the number of tended/raised animals disposed for slaughter/dressing including animals shipped-out for slaughter/dressing (in "head/bird" and in "liveweight equivalent")

* volume of production is in metric tons, liveweight for all commodities, except chicken egg, and duck egg which is in metric tons

Livestock refers to farm animals kept or raised for consumption, work or leisure. For purposes of census and surveys, livestock covers only those that are tended and raised by an operator.

Poultry is a collective term for all domesticated avian for the purpose of food consumption, or the carcass of such avian are processed for human consumption.
